**The 2010 Awards Dinner celebrates the best of British engineering achievement and innovation.**

**The Royal Academy of Engineering MacRobert Award** comprising a gold medal and a prize of £50,000, is Britain's most prestigious prize for innovation in engineering. It is awarded annually to an individual or small team who have successfully developed innovative ideas in engineering.

**The Royal Academy of Engineering Prince Philip Medal** In 1989 HRH The Prince Philip, Duke of Edinburgh, Senior Fellow of The Royal Academy of Engineering, agreed to the commissioning of a gold medal to be 'awarded periodically to an engineer of any nationality who has made an exceptional contribution to engineering as a whole through practice, management or education', to be known as the Prince Philip Medal.

**The Royal Academy of Engineering International Medal** is awarded occasionally to an individual, resident outside the European Union, for his or her outstanding and sustained personal achievement in the broad field of engineering, including commercial or academic leadership or for specific products and/or projects.

**The Silver Medal** recognises outstanding personal contributions to British engineering, reflected in commercial success, by engineers with less than 22 years in full time employment or equivalent.

**The Royal Academy of Engineering/ ERA Foundation Entrepreneurs Award** is presented to an individual or team demonstrating considerable entrepreneurial promise and the potential to benefit the UK's future prosperity. The award seeks to identify entrepreneurial researchers, working in UK universities, in the field of electro-technology, who are at an early stage in their career.

**The Rooke Medal – for the Public Promotion of Engineering** is awarded to an individual, small team or organisation who has contributed to the Academy's aims and work through their initiative in promoting engineering to the public. The medal may recognise a specific theme, or pick out a general area for recognition as determined by the Academy's Awards Committee.
