Professor Dracos Vassalos

Awarded for catalysing the development of goal-based legislation in the maritime industry and the utilisation of first principles safety performance assessment tools to foster cost-effective safety improvement.

Alan Powderham FREng

Awarded in recognition of his career spanning over 40 years, and for bringing engineering excellence to numerous projects by setting new industry benchmarks in foundation engineering.

2009

Professor Sir Bernard Crossland CBE FREng FRS

Awarded for his contribution to engineering education research work into high pressure engineering and his influence in both the UK and Ireland in forming links with industry and academia in a career spanning seven decades.

Rules and Conditions

1. Nominations are invited for The Royal Academy of Engineering Sustained Achievement Award 2012. Self nominations are not acceptable.
2. The Award will consist of an antiqued silver medal.
3. The Medal is normally awarded to an engineer resident in the UK whose achievements have had a profound impact upon their engineering discipline.
4. The recipient of the Sustained Achievement Award 2012 will be selected by the Council of The Royal Academy of Engineering on the recommendation of the Awards Committee.
5. One Medal will be awarded annually. The Medal will not be awarded if in any year the Council so decides.
6. Submissions should be made on the accompanying form (available also on **www.raeng.org.uk**) and sent to The Royal Academy of Engineering and must give the following information:
 - a. Particulars of nominee.
 - b. Citation of not more than 500 words (*you must provide evidence of the range of their achievements and their lasting effects and influence.*)
 - c. Curriculum vitae of not more than two pages should be attached.
 - d. Letters of support from two referees should be attached.

Only completed nominations will be considered.

Please ensure that the nomination form is complete with CV and letters of support at the time of submission.

7. Submissions must arrive no later than Monday 27 February 2012.
